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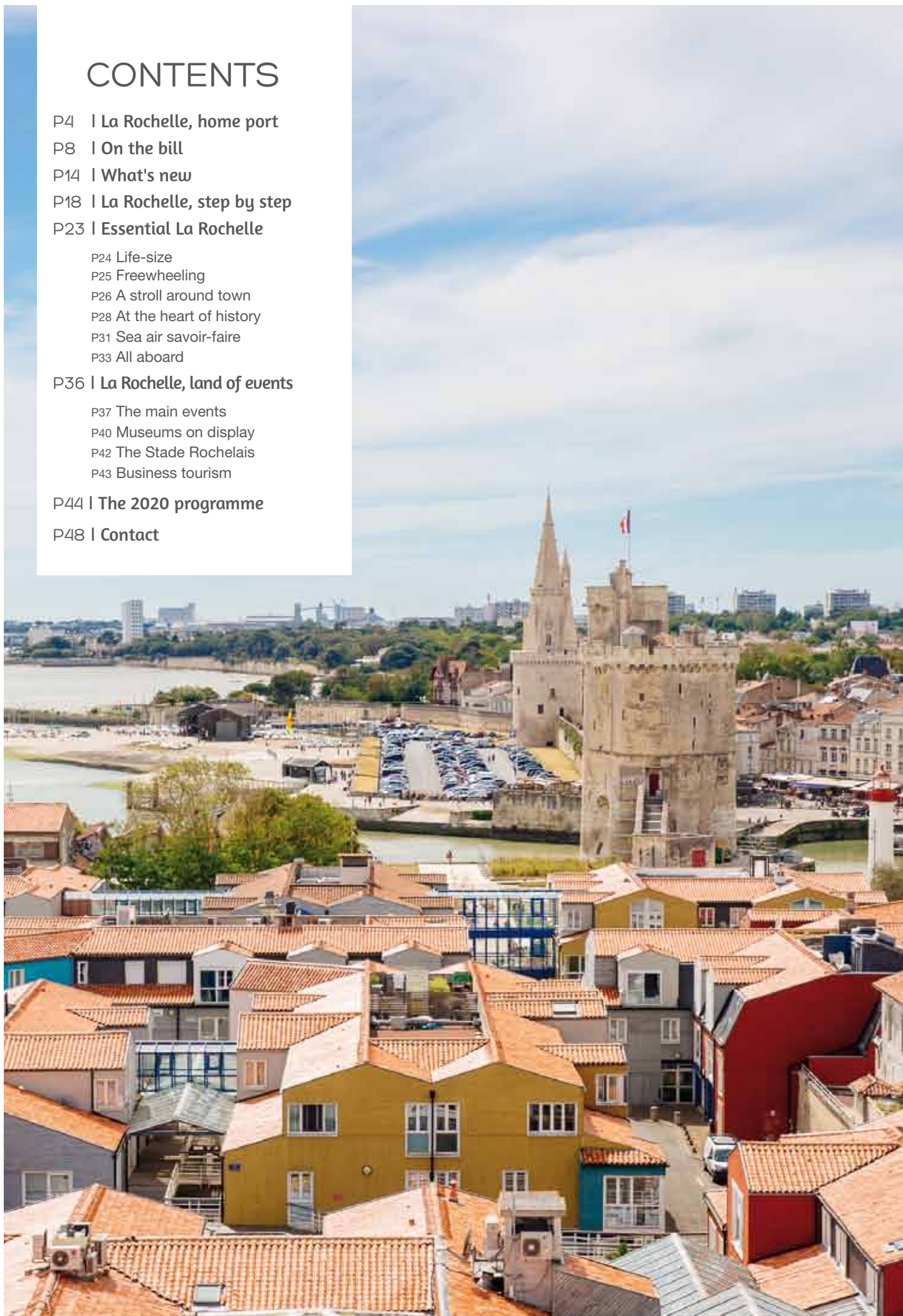
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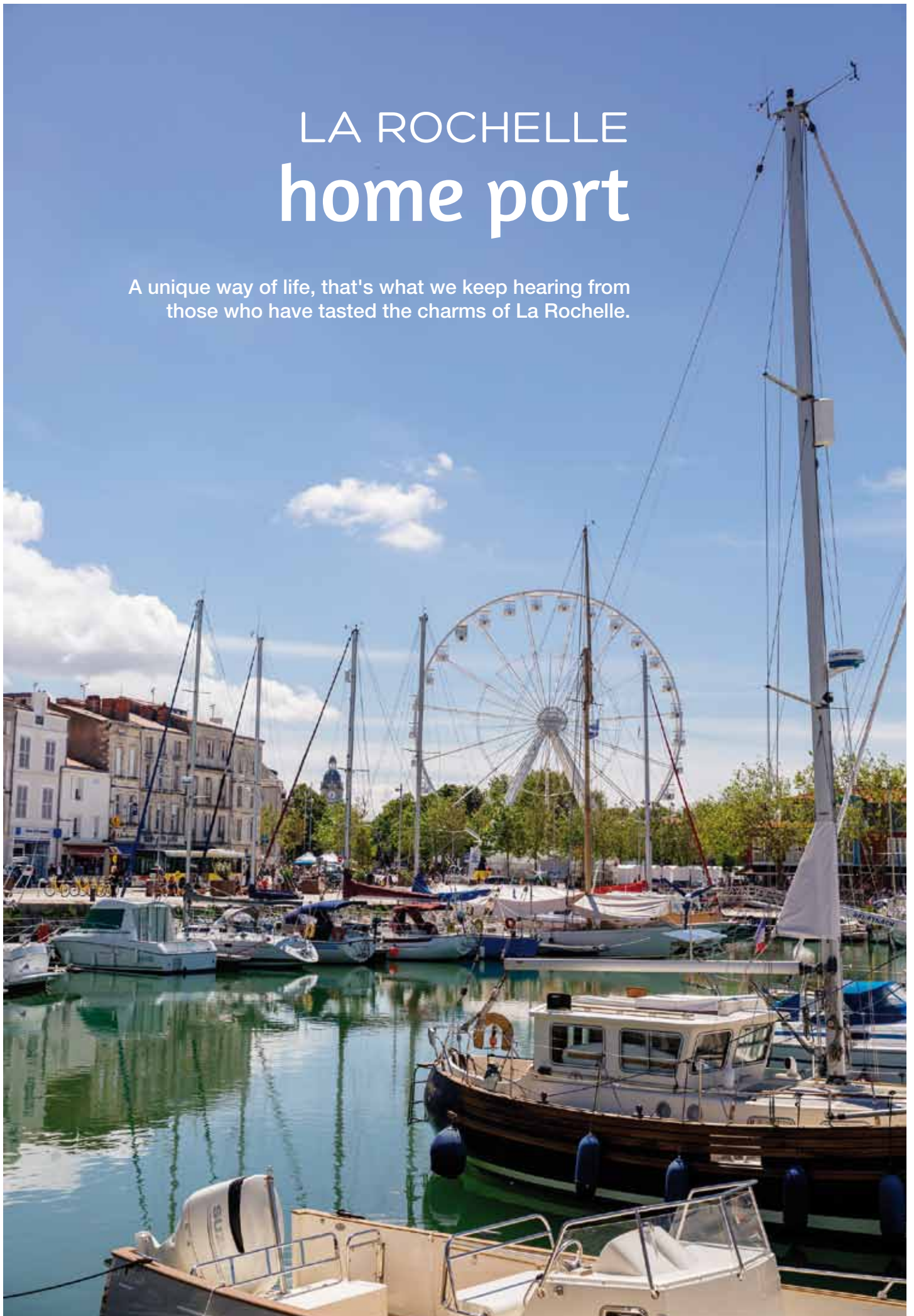

Ideally located on the Atlantic coast between Nantes and Bordeaux, 2hr30 from Paris Montparnasse since July 2017 thanks to the LGV high-speed train and many French and European cities thanks to the increasing service provided by its airport, La Rochelle is yours to discover all year round!

With its prestigious architectural heritage, it's great to stroll around the Old Port and historic centre of La Rochelle to discover its many treasures: arcaded streets, half-timbered houses, mansions and all kinds of secret cul-de-sacs are just waiting to be discovered.

A town steeped in history then, but perfectly anchored in its time: Grand Pavois, Francofolies, International Film Festival... There are countless events and trade fairs that have become well established in the city for many years. A few days in La Rochelle are enough to understand how truly dynamic it is.

With unforgettable trips to the islands of Ré, Aix and Oléron with their exceptional views, La Rochelle can also be discovered by sea. With more than 4500 berths, Minimes Marina is now one of the largest ports in the world and its nautical facilities are an open invitation to all sailing enthusiasts.

Since the end of the 1970s, La Rochelle has been a pioneer in the field of urban ecology, and more than 230 kilometres of cycle routes allow cycling fans to discover La Rochelle and its surrounding area.

La Rochelle thus offers a successful marriage between its shops and its historic heart, the flavours and colours of its markets, the Old Port and its terraces, the fine restaurants, some of them gastro with 2 Michelin-starred chefs and a rich, eclectic nightlife... All this helps make up the unique atmosphere of La Rochelle.

The agglomeration of La Rochelle is also an extraordinary destination, rich in unsuspected gems hidden here and there through its charming towns and villages. But be aware: they won't reveal themselves so easily... It takes a pinch of curiosity, a zest of audacity and a sensitivity towards what's around us, to be able to get close and touch for yourself the great stories that are hidden there...

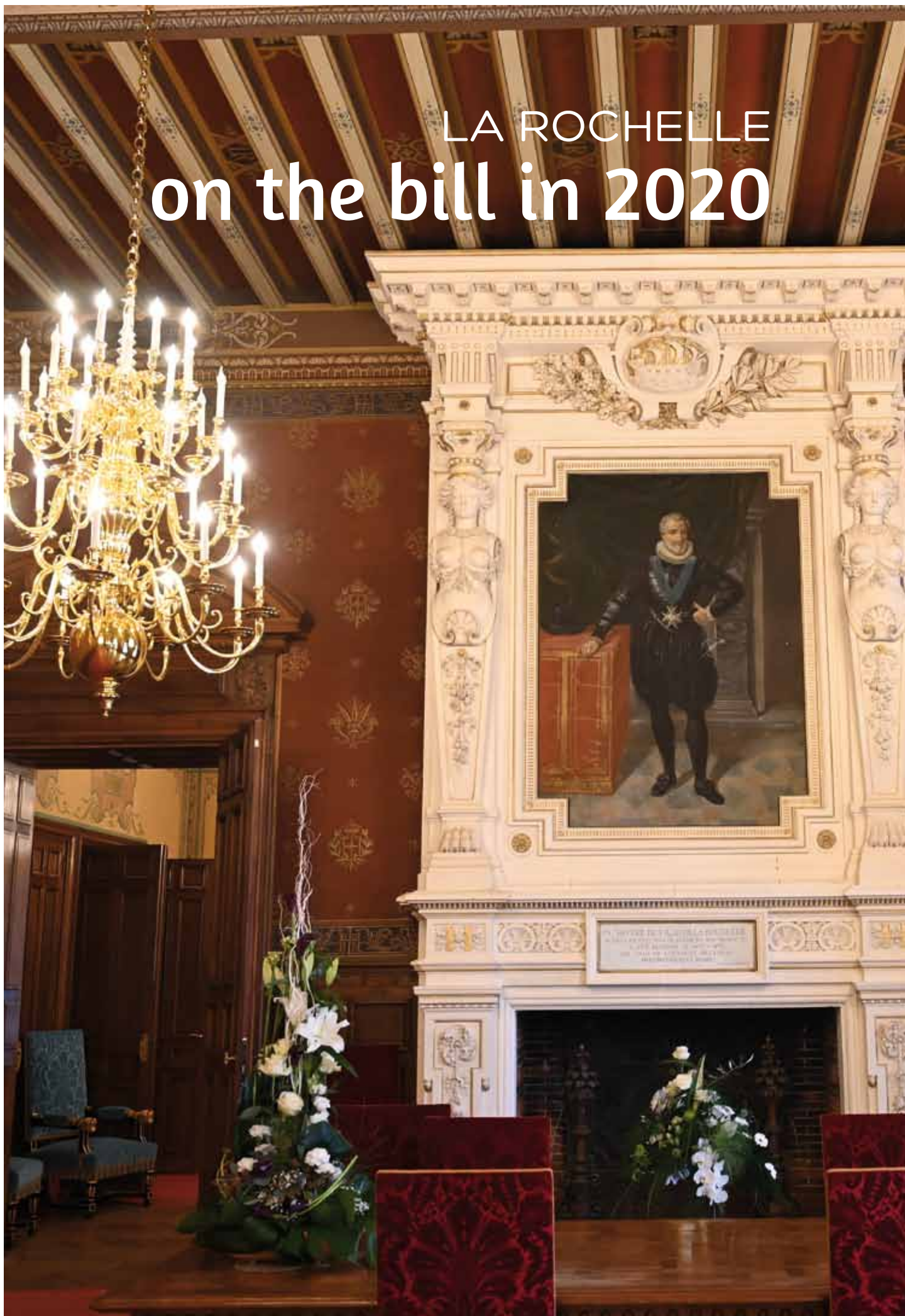

THE TOUR DE FRANCE

The Tour de France 2020 stops in Charente-Maritime on 6, 7 and 8 July.

Stage 10, evocatively named "L'Echappée Maritime" (Maritime Getaway), will take cyclists from island to island. Starting from Château d'Oléron, they will follow the Charente coast to reach Saint-Martin de Ré via La Rochelle and its surrounding villages. Then, on 8 July, head for Châtelaillon-Plage, near La Rochelle, for the start of stage 11 towards Poitiers.

For La Rochelle, the "Yellow Jersey" of cycling cities in 2018, seeing the Tour de France riders pass through the Old Port is a nice nod to the policy to develop the use of bicycles, an integral part of La Rochelle's identity since 1976 and the first self-service bicycles.

As a resting town, La Rochelle will welcome the riders for a rest day on site at the end of the stage. As the riders pass through, La Rochelle will offer entertainment to the locals and many visitors present.

La Rochelle, first cycling city in 2020

La Rochelle ranks first among cycling cities with 50 000 to 100 000 inhabitants according to the "Parlons vélo" (Let's talk bikes) barometer. In 2017, it had already won the title with a score of 3.6/6. This year, it's improving to reach 5/6.

In La Rochelle, we love cycling, and with good reason! In 1976, our beautiful city was the first in France to offer self-service bicycles. With its 230 kilometres of cycling facilities and its living environment well suited to cycling, La Rochelle and its agglomeration offer a multitude of opportunities to get some fresh air!

REOPENING OF THE TOWN HALL

On 28 June 2013 at 1.55pm, a major fire broke out in La Rochelle's Town Hall.

Behind its high Gothic wall topped by a belfry tower, this iconic building held many memories of the city. Thanks to the work of the fire brigade and La Rochelle Town Hall's technical teams, all these treasures were saved from the flames and water. The Aubusson tapestries, the large painting of the Siege as well as the furniture of the function room were all entrusted to experts to be restored and thus save the history of La Rochelle.

A SHORT HISTORY

OF LA ROCHELLE'S TOWN HALL

1298 The members of the Corps de Ville of La Rochelle buy five houses and their gardens to build the first Town Hall.

1298 Reconstruction of the Town Hall surrounded by a crenellated enclosure wall with a machicolation and corner tower, symbols of the power of the independence of the Corps de Ville.

1540 La Rochelle becomes the bastion of Protestantism.

1595 - 1607 Resumption of work on the huge Renaissance project, which ends with the construction of the "Chamber of Aldermen" under the protection of King Henry IV. It houses the command centre.

1627 - 1628 The Great Siege ordered by Richelieu, Minister to the King of France, Louis XIII. They suppress the communal organisation of La Rochelle.

1718 Re-establishment of an elective mayor's office.

1748 The municipal administration regains its Town Hall.

1861 The Town Hall is classified as a Historic Monument.

1872 - 1877 Restoration and restructuring of the building by the architect Juste Lisch.

1945 La Rochelle is the last prefecture liberated from the Germans (2nd World War).

2013 Town Hall fire. The fire spreads from the attic of the Aldermen's Pavilion to the archives, then consumes the entire roof structure of the function room.

2016 Start of reconstruction work under the leadership of the architect-in-chief of Historic Monuments. 26 trades worked on the reconstruction of the Town Hall.

2019 Town Hall opens to the public in December.

From 19 November 2019 to 31 October 2021

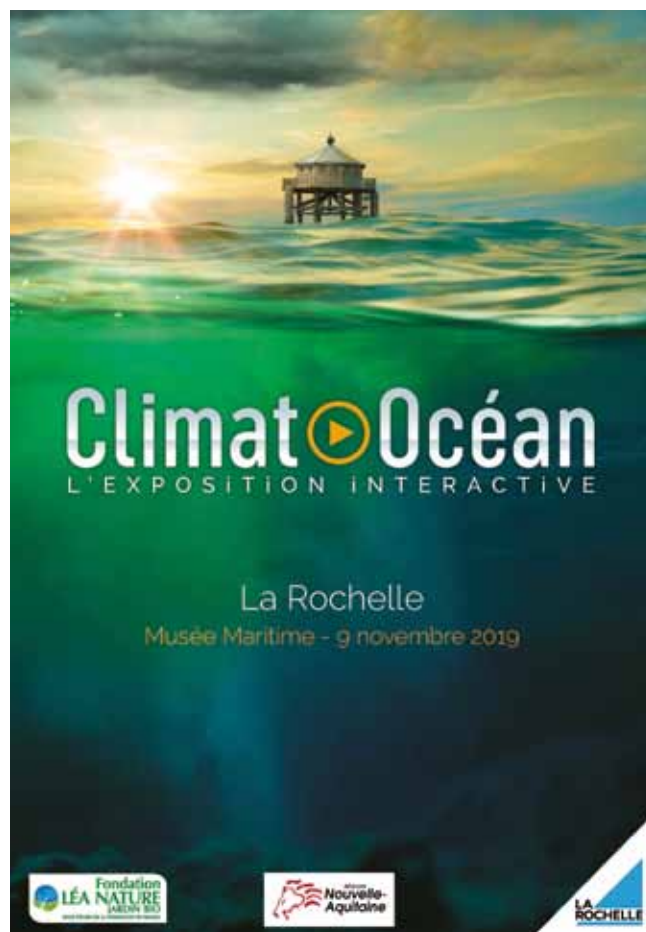
The first major exhibition devoted to the Ocean and its leading role in climate creation! Conceived in partnership with a scientific committee, it alerts the public and mobilises conscience.

Over 300m², it takes the visitor into a little-known, lush world for a unique experience. From the Atlantic coasts to the Pacific Islands, from the atmosphere to the deepest abyss, you can discover, among other things, the birth of a tornado and the rise of sea levels, thanks to innovative devices and interactive animations.

This immersive journey can be discovered through 7 presentations:

- ✓ The effects and consequences of these regulations
- ✓ Paleoclimates or the history of climates from the beginning
- ✓ How to continue to live with these risks: by adapting

BECOME A LIGHTHOUSE KEEPER

24 hours alone in the lighthouse at the end of the world

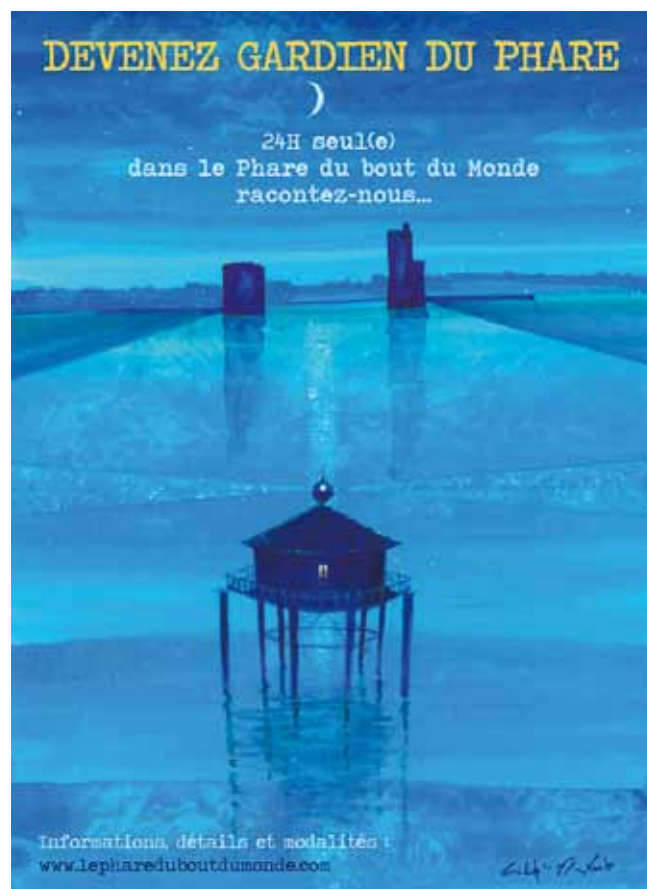
To mark the 20th anniversary of the Lighthouse of the World, the association of the same name opens its doors to all those who wish to spend a night or 24 hours alone in the Lighthouse at the End of the World located at Pointe des Minimes.

The history of an iconic monument in La Rochelle:

This lighthouse is Europe's replica of the Lighthouse at the End of the World. Located on Staten Island in Argentinean territory, off Cape Horn, it was made famous by the last novel by Jules Verne published in 1905. Erected in 1884, it was abandoned in 1902 due to the inhospitable living conditions on the island. It was rediscovered in 1994 by the adventurer from La Rochelle, André Bronner, who undertook its reconstruction with a team of 10 people. On 26 February 1998, the Lighthouse at the End of the World was rekindled and the ambition for a second lighthouse to light up the coasts of Europe began. On 1 January 2000, 12 780 km from Staten Island, in La Rochelle, the replica of the Lighthouse at the End of the World was born.

The "Become a Lighthouse Keeper" project:

"If you've dreamed of being like a Robinson Crusoe on his island, an adventurer, or simply disconnecting from your daily life, we offer a way to get out of society and imagine a different world, far from the hustle and bustle. Isolation is



an accelerator of the imagination, and the Lighthouse at the End of the World in La Rochelle provides the perfect setting: become a Lighthouse Keeper! ».

Equipped only with a VHF, the sailor's communication system, the lighthouse keeper takes his or her turn alone, without any means of communication. In exchange, volunteers must tell of their experience, their emotions and sensations felt during these 24 hours, in writing or any other mode of artistic expression.

It was a great success, as the 220 candidates were selected in less than two months. Just a few places are still available and reserved only for artists.

The lighthouse keeper's dream

Regardless of their output and in partnership with the University of La Rochelle and the fantasy geographer Louis MARROU, the lighthouse keepers are invited, if they so wish (and if they remember...) to write down the dream they had during their night on watch. But also to report the appearance of the lighthouse in their dreams before and after that night for a programme to research the geography of dreams.

More projects in 2020 and a big celebration!

At the La Rochelle conurbation level, conferences for the general public, as well as educational and artistic workshops, will be offered to residents, as well as to schools.

From 30 September to 5 October 2020, the major celebration "Meet at the Lighthouses" will be held at Minimes Beach, during the Grand Pavois.

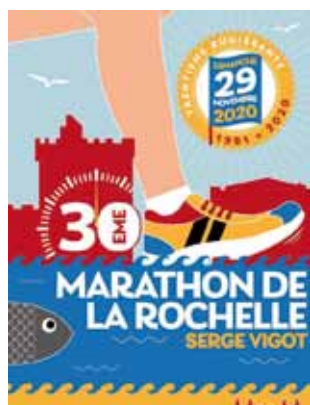

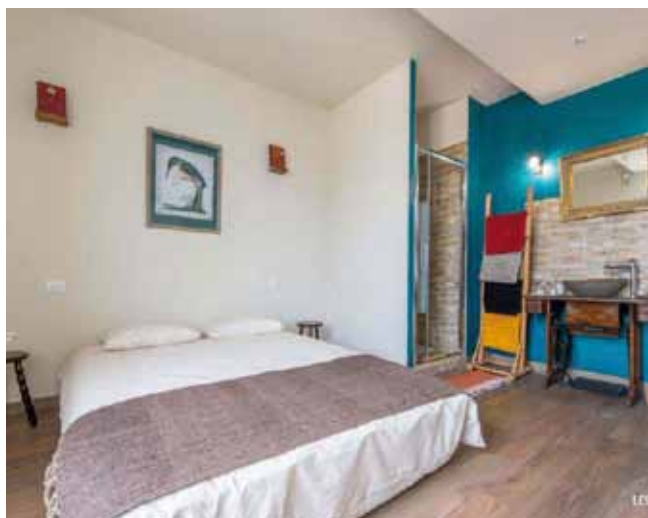

DAY 1

9.00am Meet on the Old Port to enjoy a nice coffee in the company of the Towers of La Rochelle, the guardians of the city! You'll love the peace and quiet of the Old Port in the early morning.

One coffee later, head for the Saint-Nicolas tower. A real urban keep, it offers a wonderful view of the city and the ocean. Take the opportunity to discover the exhibition "It happened tomorrow" at the Chaîne Tower. More info p.29

11.30am Once back down, go to the old 19th-century covered market hall. Here, the sellers and producers share their love of local products with passion and generosity. With a basket on your arm, treat yourself to some of the local specialities: seafood, fish, pork scratchings and farci charentais, pineau, cognac or charentais melon. Around the market halls, cafés and bistros have joined forces with the market producers to offer an oyster tasting accompanied by a glass of white wine to better enjoy the lively, friendly atmosphere of the market!



1.00pm The market district is full of great places to eat with menus bursting with fresh produce! You can taste seasonal cuisine designed and created with fresh market products.

2.00pm A stroll to aid digestion is called for! Here, what could be better than a little shopping, looking for souvenirs to give away or keep for yourself? From the pedestrian streets to the arcaded roads and small lively squares, the diversity and uniqueness of the shops is sure to delight!

A favourite is the Saint-Nicolas district. Formerly a fishermen's village with a bohemian spirit, it's here that many creators and craftsmen have settled and offer a "100% Made in LR" shopping experience.

4.00pm Then head for the Maritime Museum, a floating dockside museum. To get there, head along the Bassin des Chalutiers which is home to some of the Yacht Club's collection of old wooden boats. Arriving in the district of Les Minimes, you reach the coast and the parks of Les Minimes and Les Pères. These parks with their southern vegetation offer an incredible balcony overlooking the sea. In the distance, you can admire the Lighthouse at the End of the World, the renowned replica made famous by Jules Vernes. In good weather, you can also see Fort Boyard.

Return to La Rochelle along Port des Minimes to Allée des Tamaris for a refreshing trip. Take a break on the grass in front of the entrance to the Old Port and relax to the coming and going of the boats.



1.00pm Lunch at the "Là-Haut" brasserie located above La Rochelle's Aquarium. The view is breathtaking!

Life-size

From Pointe Saint-Clément in the north to Baie d'Yves in the south, white roads stretch out along a changing coastline. You can choose portions of this 70 km coastal route, punctuated here and there by fishing huts that cut into the horizon. Many starting points are possible, from Coup de Vague in Marsilly up towards Esnandes, from Pointe du Roux in Aytré to Pointe du Chay in Angoulins, from the port of Le Plomb between Nieul and Houmeau or the port of Le Loiron in Angoulins, from Boucholeurs to the Baie d'Yves... to name but a few.

THE NATURE RESERVE OF MARAIS D'YVES

A former lagoon protected by a dune barrier, the Baie d'Yves Nature Reserve is home to an extraordinary biological diversity, both for birds and fauna and from a botanical point of view, with more than 570 different plant species. The League for the Protection of Birds (which manages the site) invites you to observe birds through multiple themed walks.

Depending on the season, you can get acquainted with the white stork, avocet, reed harrier, kingfisher and many other species that have made this protected area a resting place on their long migratory route.

MARANS CANAL, THE GREEN STREAM

When you've had your fill of beach, walking along the Marans Canal is a green change of scenery for you to enjoy. Whether you walk, cycle or even canoe along it, this waterway that flows at the bottom of its chlorophyll cradle produces a relaxing Zen effect. Here, nature is everywhere! Many species are protected and have flourished to populate the waters and banks of the canal. 24 km long, it is dotted with remarkable points, leisure and picnic areas, and follows the routes of La Vélodyssée® and La Vélofrancette®, to the delight of cycle tourists! By canoe, the calm waters of the canal are particularly suited to family trips.

DISCOVERY TRAILS

Here a well, there an old mill, a stream, the remains of a château or a cartouche carved in a stone facade. What does this heritage tell us? The agglomeration of La Rochelle makes up a region where nature and culture intermingle wonderfully. To discover it, you have to follow its 17 or so discovery trails, creating loops of 1hr to 4hr walking from the villages surrounding La Rochelle.

Fishing from a "carrelet" is a 100% Charente tradition. Carrelets are fishing huts where pontoons protrude over the foreshore so fishermen can lower their large square nets into the water and bring up all sorts of species: eels, sea bass, sole, shrimp ... depending on luck and the season. Educational carrelets have been built and can be discovered in Esnandes and Angoulins.



PARKS AND GARDENS OF LA ROCHELLE

La Rochelle's parks with their changing atmospheres extend over nearly 350 hectares. Oceanic or Mediterranean, tamed or cleverly disordered, they invite you to stroll and relax... Equipped with cycle paths, walks, an animal park and playgrounds, they are the true lungs of the city.

Valin Square: the inhabitants of La Rochelle and holiday makers can enjoy new public spaces along the quay of the Old Port: playground, merry-go-round, mist fountain, fast food kiosk, trees replanted...

With some 230 kilometres of cycle routes, La Rochelle and its agglomeration offer a multitude of opportunities for a change of scenery.

In La Rochelle, we love cycling, and for good reason! In 1976, our wonderful city was the first in France to offer self-service bicycles. Here, we've made it a way of life! There's nothing better than riding a two-wheeler to search out all the treasures this territory has to offer.

During a ride in the open air along the coastline or in the surrounding countryside, to reach the famous covered market halls or wander through the narrow streets and the Old Port of La Rochelle, a bike is the perfect companion for discovering all its riches.

La Rochelle lends itself perfectly to cycle tourism. Today crossed by 2 famous cycle routes, the Vélodyssée® and Vélofrancette®, they offer sportsmen and women a well-deserved stop at the foot of its famous towers!



IDEA GREAT!

The Loopi app and La Rochelle Tourisme offer cycle tourists the opportunity to discover the many routes and discovery loops to try out in the surrounding area. Once you've chosen the route according to your preferences and ability, just let yourself be guided thanks to the integrated GPS (available offline). Many points of interest will attract the attention of the curious and are explained along the way. The app also offers a route planner, which recommends a route focusing on biking roads and cycle paths.

THE VELODYSSÉE®

This cycle route is the French part of Euro-cycle route no.1 which runs from Norway to Portugal. In Charente-Maritime, its route extends over a 150 km route.

Easy, safe, marked out, dotted with unmissable treasures, it's accessible to all at any pace.

Two stages are covered through the La Rochelle agglomeration. Number 33 between Marans and La Rochelle (25.5km, about 2hr30, intermediate level) which follows the pleasant green flow of the Marans Canal, its locks, its calm, its vegetation leaning over the water. Number 34 between La Rochelle and Châtelailon-Plage for a nice trip along the coast (14.3km, about 1hr30, family level).



THE VELOFRANCETTE®

This 630 km long cycle route links the English Channel to the Atlantic from the city of Caen in Normandy as far as La Rochelle, for a 100% natural journey. It joins the Vélodyssée along the Marans Canal. It is accessible to all at any pace.

THE OLD PORT, AN EMBLEM

The Old Port is a must when you visit La Rochelle, for a day, a weekend, a week or even a lifetime! A true blue lung in the heart of the old town, it's the jewel of the maritime city. Its lively quays offer visitors a moment of relaxation to stroll around a breathtaking setting where ages intermingle. It's true that life here is in full swing: bars and terraces on the Duperré and Valin quays, restaurants at the foot of the majestic towers, a craft market in the shade of the trees in the Cour des Dames, a buzzing open-air dance hall in the Gabut industrial wasteland and the comings and goings of cruise ships at sea!

The city has been working for several years to bring out the best of its Old Port, now completely pedestrianised. The main focus is therefore on walkers and cyclists who'll love the calm and serenity of its surroundings.

SAINT-NICOLAS DISTRICT

A real village within the city, this former fishermen's quarter is very popular with the people of La Rochelle for its unique charm. Today, it's become the "bohemian" district and is home to second-hand shops, art galleries, bookstores and small shady squares. It's here that many local craftsmen can be found, such as "Esprit Voile" which makes numerous accessories using boat sails.

La Rochelle Bunker

Built in the heart of the historic city centre in the greatest secrecy in 1941, to then remain intact and forgotten, this incredible bunker, the shelter of a German admiral and submarine commanders during the 2nd World War, has been open to the public since 2013.

On an educational trail of 250m², we plunge into a world of emotions by discovering the key characters in the history of La Rochelle during the conflict. A modern museography based on a very rich collection of local items: photos, posters, documents.

MARITIME MUSEUM

"Ships to visit", a maritime heritage to experience: the Maritime Museum's fleet gathered at the quayside is grouped together at the bottom of the Bassin des Chalutiers around its "flagship", the meteorological frigate France 1. As such, it offers the public the opportunity to come on board to "live" and understand the different ships and their functions. The Angoumois illustrates the period of industrial fishing and the Saint-Gilles, the specific features of tugboats.

Yours to admire and discover while strolling on the pontoons, the other ships of the Maritime Museum, true Historical Monuments and exceptional Classic Yachts grouped between the France 1 and the Encan building.

The pavilion gallery

April 2015 saw the opening of the Maritime Museum's new gallery of pavilions with a major permanent exhibition devoted to the history of La Rochelle through its ports.

THE TOWERS OF LA ROCHELLE

St Nicholas' Tower

A true urban keep and palatial residence facing the ocean, this military building symbolises the power and wealth of La Rochelle. 42 metres high, its architecture revolves around a maze of stairs and corridors built into the thickness of the walls.

Chain Tower

Gateway to the Old Port, the Chain Tower monitored ship movements, port traffic and collected fees and taxes.

Lantern Tower

The last medieval lighthouse on the Atlantic coast, 70 metres high, topped by an octagonal Gothic spire, the tower has served throughout history as a lighthouse and prison. This prison function explains some 600 pieces of graffiti by British, Dutch and Spanish privateers.



It happened tomorrow

6 April to 8 November 2020

Exhibition designed by the City of Poitiers in co-production with the Centre for National Monuments.

The exhibition explores the world of science fiction comics by bringing to life 3 comic book albums: "Dans la combi de Thomas Pesquet" by Marion Montaigne, "Shangri-La" by Mathieu Babelt, "Universal War One" by Denis Bajram.

LOGIS DE LA RICHARDIERE, IN MARSILLY

"A timeless place, contemplative poetics and a source of inspiration" are the words of Jane Anne, current mistress of the place, to describe this manor house built in 1489. It's within this authentic place that the owner welcomes artists, painters, poets and photographers, who draw inspiration from this balance between matter and spirit. This haven of peace, a place for exchanges and meetings dedicated to culture and well-being, is open to the public; especially its park and outbuildings.

Anecdote

Georges Simenon, father of the famous Commissioner Maigret, lived there with his wife from 1932 to 1934. This place also inspired his novel "Le Testament Donnadiou"



CHURCH OF ST MARTIN, IN ESNANDES

Built in the 12th century and fortified in the 16th, the church was classified as a Historic Monument in 1840. It surprises with its imposing, unusual appearance, mixing both the architecture of a place of worship and a fortress. From its ramparts, on the parapet walk you can admire an exceptional view of the Bay of Aiguillon.

BEAUTIFUL BOURGEOIS HOUSES IN SALLES-SUR-MER

While the town does not border the coast, there's plenty of water in the form of marshes. These humid areas have given it a typical vegetation very much appreciated by the 17th-century bourgeoisie of La Rochelle who built their country residences there. The châteaux of Hérauderie, Montagne-la-Jeune, Roulet, Cramahé, Héronnière and Borderies bear witness to this rich past, providing a popular holiday destination for city dwellers. This fine architectural heritage contributes greatly to the charm of the town. Yours to discover thanks to the discovery trail.



CHÂTEAU DE BUZAY, IN LA JARNE

With its period furniture, evocative of a certain charm, Château de Buzay bears witness to a way of life that La Rochelle experienced when the special links between its port and the colonies of the New World were established. Its unique architecture, with its perfectly proportioned lines, makes it a model of harmony. As for the château's park, it provides a wonderful setting, laid out according to the landscape rules of the 19th century. This château has been the property of the same family since the first stone was laid by Pierre-Etienne Harouard, Lieutenant of the Admiralty of La Rochelle, in 1771.

The only deep-water port on the Atlantic coast, La Rochelle Atlantic Port welcomed 29 cruise ships and their 30 000 passengers in 2018!



MINIMES YACHT MARINA

Just 15 minutes' walk from the historic centre of La Rochelle, the port is ideally located for all yachtsmen making a stopover: connections to the city centre provided by bus lines and the electro-solar sea bus; presence of a cycle path and pedestrian walkway. On foot or by bike, the Allée des Tamaris, starting from the Vieux Port, offers a sea air walk along the seafront, at the end of which we find the Port des Minimes. Take the opportunity to cross the "Nelson Mandela" Footbridge to reach the "New World" seawall: a great opportunity to walk "on the sea" and contemplate the comings and goings of the boats!

Today, as one of the world's leading ports with more than 5000 berths and the leading marina on the Atlantic coast, La Rochelle's marina aims for excellence in terms of reception and services: having been awarded 4 anchors out of 5 by the Gold Anchors, it offers 450 individual "visitor" places, including 90 at the Old Port, in the heart of town.

PORT DU PLOMB, IN L'HOUMEAU

Long before La Rochelle erected its famous towers, Port du Plomb was home to ships carrying wheat and wine from its hinterland as early as the 10th century. It next became a fishing port, then an oyster-farming port, and today mainly a haven of peace for pleasure boats that cast their colourful reflections on the waters of the channel.

Here, you can enjoy freshly picked seafood with a sea view and set sail on old rigs alongside enthusiasts eager to share their love of the ocean and the maritime history of the region. It's also a special place for families to take a walk, from where you can reach the coastal paths.

FISHING PORT OF LA ROCHELLE

This is where it all starts! Every day, several species of fish and crustaceans are landed on the pontoons of the Fishing Port, heading for auction where fishermen, fishmongers, wholesalers and retailers rub shoulders. These seafood products are then shipped to the many restaurateurs in La Rochelle or end up on the market stalls.

Witness this know-how for yourself? In La Rochelle, it's possible! The team from the Fishing Port invites the curious to go behind the scenes by attending an auction of seafood products. Warm clothing and closed shoes are required to see the various facilities of the auction and trace all the stages of fish transportation. Every year, more than 6000 tons of fish pass through the Fishing Port of La Rochelle, making it the 4th largest fishing port in France.

Legend of the land of the mussel beds

The production of shellfish, oysters and mussels forms a central part of the local history, and has partly shaped the coastal landscape. The Bay of Aiguillon is thus the birthplace of the mussel bed.

Legend has it that a terrible storm in 1235 drove onto the coast of Esnandes the boat of an Irish sailor named Patrick Walson. There was nothing around him at that time, nothing but birds that he tried to catch for food by tying nets between wooden poles driven into the mud-flat. The birds avoided capture, but on the other hand, the posts under water at high tide became covered with mussels. The harvest was plentiful and the sailor was saved. The mussel bed was born, one of the best in Europe, a must to enjoy during a stay in the region.

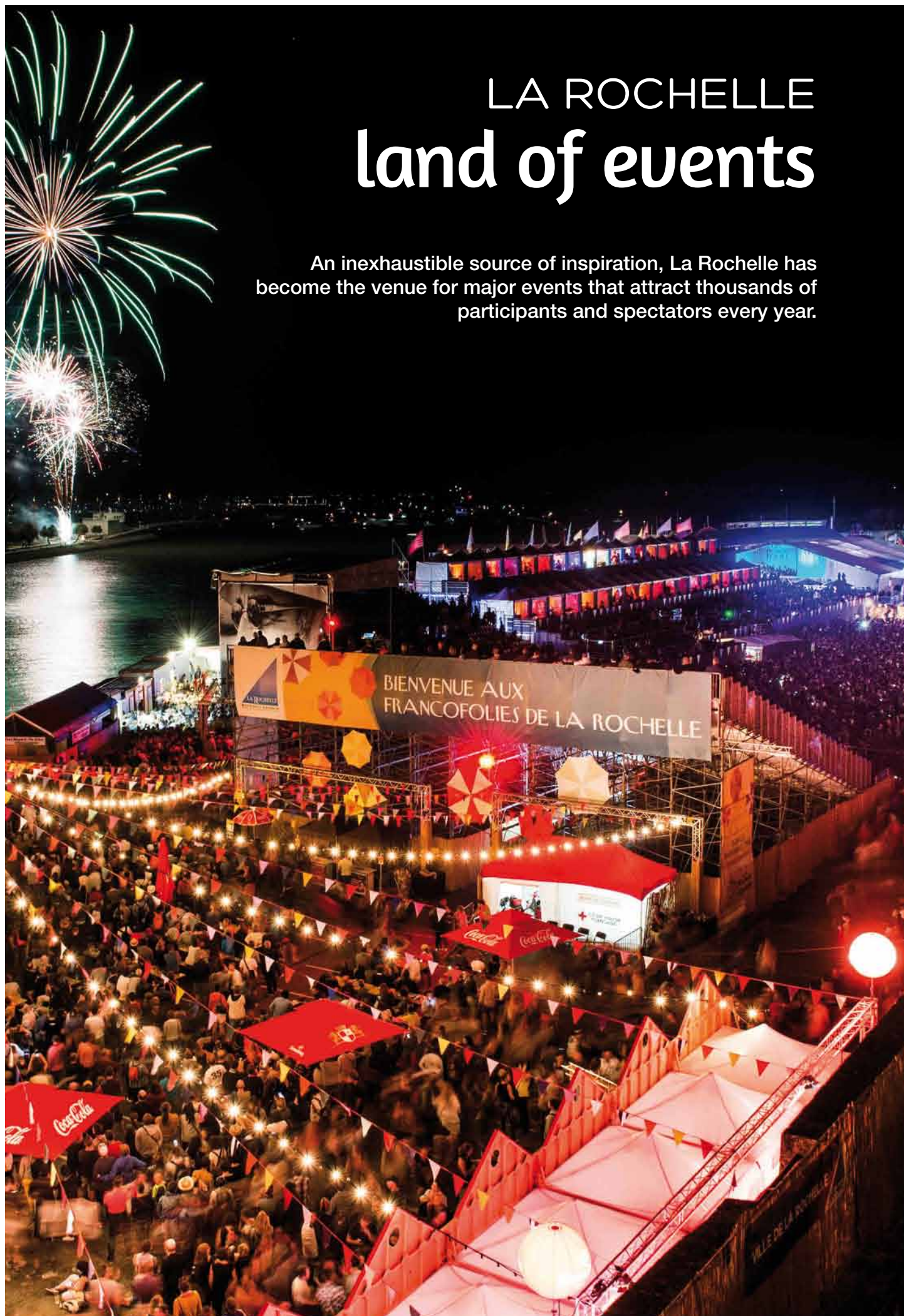

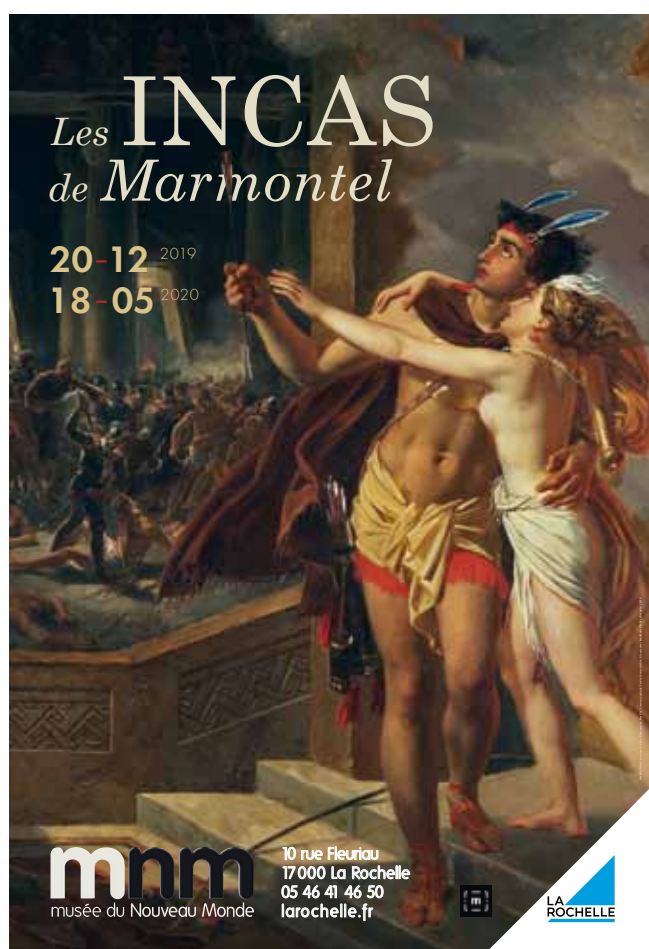
